The United Methodist community in Ukraine, though quite small, is actively engaged in assisting neighbors in need. Global Ministries is in touch with the church's leadership as well as with church leaders in countries welcoming those who are fleeing from violence in Ukraine.

Also, Asbury has been invited to partner with the **Jefferson-Lewis Board of Realtors**. They have been working with the **St. John the Baptist Ukrainian Church in Syracuse**, **NY**, which has a viable channel through which needed supplies are getting into Ukraine at this time.

From the FINANCE COMMITTEE

A Letter to Our Asbury Family,

The Finance Committee thanks everyone who has faithfully supported the church financially for many years. With your support of time, talents and gifts, Asbury has been able to faithfully serve its membership and, indeed, the Watertown community at large very successfully.

We want you to be informed of our current financial situation. At present, we are having difficulty "making our ends meet." There are several reasons for this. Although everything can't be blamed on the Covid virus, it has played a significant role in causing the current financial problem. Covid has kept Sunday service attendance below anticipated levels. With reduced attendance has come reduced money intake. In addition, we have lost some of our membership and regular givers. Some have moved to new homes in new towns, and the rest have moved to homes in heaven. These people represented some very faithful givers. We have not been able to make up for that lost revenue.

We also want to share with you a chart to highlight some of the changes to larger line items of our budget. These amounts, (except for payroll), are mostly fixed. We have included this year's anticipated costs, and the previous 2 years actual amount spent (this is only a portion of the total budget.)

(While we have spent much money on our building these past few years, and continue to do so, those moneys were/are generated by the Capital Fund Drive, giving to Capital Improvements and earnings from our Endowment, which is managed by the Trustees. We have not included those figures in this letter).

You will note above that we have reduced payroll for 2022. This was because of Max Bovee's retirement as Assistant to the Pastor. It was our hope that this important position would have an updated job description and be filled in the fall if our finances improved. We are still hopeful!

We know very well that this is a challenging time financially. Rising gas prices, food prices and utility costs affect each of us. Be assured that your Finance Committee is doing its very best to stretch every dollar you generously and cheerfully give. We wholeheartedly feel that a problem shared is a problem solved, so it is in this hope that we reach out to you now to fulfill your pledges and to consider increasing your giving. Thank you so much for loving Asbury and trusting us to manage the funds as responsibly as we can.

HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

What does home mean to you?

I looked up the definition of home on the internet and this is what I found:

"the place where one lives permanently, especially as a member of a family or household."

I also found:

"The English word home is from the Old English word hām (not the pig) which actually refers to a village or estate (or perhaps a community) where many "souls" are gathered. It implies there's a physical dwelling involved, but the main idea is that it's a gathering of people."

Lastly, I found:

"Your Spiritual home is the place where you feel that you belong, usually because your ideas or attitudes are the same as those of the people who live (or reside) there."

Putting all of these definitions together, makes me think *home is where your heart is*. Since God resides in our hearts in the form of the Holy Spirit, I would think that for each of us, home is where we find God. Since God is with us always, home can be different for each of us and can be found in more than one place.

For me, home is where I first met God and where I know I can always find him when the world becomes too much for me and I feel lost. That place is Asbury. Livestreaming is a wonderful way God gave us to worship and connect during Covid and when we are not physically able to gather at Asbury. But for me, it isn't the same as physically gathering and worshiping under that big red roof where our 'beacon,' the tower, and its light always calls to me: "Come Home." As the Bible tells us:

"For where two or three gather together as my followers, I am there among them." ~ Matthew 18:20.

There is nothing more special to me than coming home after being away for a time.

Home can also be anywhere my family is gathered, including those who have passed. The joy that brings to my heart cannot be expressed in words.

Now, let's explore the meaning of *homelessness*. The dictionary definition is "the state of having no home." Notice it doesn't say, having no physical dwelling. Although homelessness can mean not having a physical place to reside, it can also mean that there are those who have not found that place in their heart where God resides and calls to them, "Come Home."

I was once physically homeless for a week when I was in between apartments. I can tell you, I have never felt so lost. I got through it with God's help. I knew He was with me, and I would be okay. Imagine being lost and not knowing God was with you. There are those out there that are homeless and lost. Let us help the homeless find their physical and spiritual home. For those of you who call Asbury home but have been away, God is calling you: "**Come Home!**"
