

Pastoral Letter: Church Membership Invitation

This coming month, I wish to warmly invite anyone who has been regularly attending our worship services, but has not yet joined the church to prayerfully consider becoming a member of Asbury Church now. <u>I will hold 2 get-togethers on Sundays</u>: March 20th and March 27th in the Parlor from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. Then <u>we will take in new members during the worship service on Sunday</u>, <u>April 3rd.</u>

You may ask, "What does it matter whether I join a church or not? How will it affect me? What is expected of me?" All good questions.

The one who becomes "changed" by joining a congregation as a member is You. The friendships you have already made and the ones you will make aren't dependent on being "papered" as an official Asburian. In fact, the issue of membership will rarely, if ever, come into conversation. Most people aren't concerned about such things.

But as I indicated above, the one who is changed is You. It's like the difference between watching a game from the bleachers versus being in the game directly. A non-member will always be, at some level, an observer of the community of faith. They cannot vote on church matters, hold office on some committees, or participate as fully as those who are members.

When one decides to join a congregation as a member, it is as if he or she is deciding to be a player on the team. One agrees to "roll up their sleeves," enter into the midst of church life, serve more intentionally, and pray more fervently.

Is there a membership fee? Of course not. Everyone gives as they are able either in monetary ways or in service to support the ministry and mission of Asbury church. When one is a part of a team, we expect everyone to simply give their best for the team.

I hope you will consider church membership this year. If you have any questions, please reach out to me either by phone or email or speak with me on Sunday mornings. I want to be the bridge that moves you to "YES."

Most of you know that John Wesley was the founder of the Methodist movement in England. But did you know that Wesley never set out to establish a new denomination separate from the Church of England? Rather, he had hoped to accomplish a revival within the Church itself.

Did you also know that Wesley was plagued with doubts about his faith? And then, on May 24, 1738, while attending a meeting on Aldersgate Street in London, he had a profound spiritual awakening where he said his heart was "strangely warmed." Wesley wrote of his experience, saying, "I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation, and an assurance was given me that He had taken away *my* sins, even *mine,* and saved *me* from the law of sin and death."

Wesley was so moved by his Aldersgate experience that he committed himself to sharing the message of salvation with the rest of the England. In fact, he famously said, "I look upon the whole world as my parish." But the bishops and clergy of Wesley's day were not so welcoming of his enthusiasm and his passion to share the Good News of the Gospel. Many banned him from their churches. And so, in true Wesleyan fashion, he hopped on his horse and commenced an itinerant ministry that lasted more than 50 years, preaching in fields and in the open air wherever he could. It is said that Wesley rode 250,000 miles, far enough to circle the Earth ten times!! Now that's dedication! It's impossible to say how many lives Wesley touched through his ministry.

Perhaps you've had the same kind of doubts Wesley had. I know I have. Am I worthy of God's love and forgiveness? Can God really love someone like me? I take heart from chapter 3 of Paul's letter to the Romans. Verses 22-24 read: "God's righteousness comes through the faithfulness of Jesus Christ for **all** who have faith in him. There's no distinction. **All** have sinned and fall short of God's glory, but **all** are treated as righteous freely by his grace because of a ransom that was paid by Christ Jesus." (Emphasis added.)

May these words warm your heart, as they have mine, and bring you assurance that God's grace is sufficient for ALL people and in all circumstances because of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. That's the Good News, and that's the message of hope John Wesley dedicated his life to sharing with others.

ROM THE TRUST

In looking at issues that are in the future, painting and repainting projects are always with us. We are currently having the ceiling in the rotunda repaired and repainted. The rotunda ceiling has been with us for about 108 years. This is a major expense and effort. The completion of this project will finish our goal that was started with the new roof in 2020.

We also have other areas that need repainting and updating. We are hoping we can do much of this work with volunteers from within our church family. Some bathrooms need repainting, some lower ceilings, and other areas around the church. This may be a list of projects that will extend over the next few years to complete. Here is what we would like to have you consider:

- If you see something that needs attention, please outline your concerns and notify the Trustees. They have a mailbox in the office.
- If you would be willing to be a volunteer, contact a Trustee.

All projects will have to be considered and coordinated by the Trustees.

A major in-house project we will tackle this summer is the refinishing of the doors and woodwork on the outside of the main entrance. This will be coordinated by Jim Juczak. Jim has experience in this type of work and has volunteered to lead our efforts. He wants as many volunteers as we can muster, male and female. Starting in June, he will train and schedule work teams who will work 2-4 hours on 5-6 Saturdays. You will not have to attend every work session, but it will be very helpful if you can. The skills you will learn can be transferred to many other things i.e. stripping and refinishing furniture, etc.


Lots of things are happening. Sharing of time and talents in the Wesley tradition strengthens our church. Come be part of this community of faith!




