ARE YOU LISTENING?

How Does God Communicate With Us?

Up until a few years ago, I couldn't answer that question. I now believe that God communicates with each of us in a way that we will, as individuals, understand. One night a few years ago, I had a dream. My earthly father, who was and is deceased, appeared to me with a message: *Something is going to happen to you*. I began to cry, and I said, *Will I be ok?* He said, *You are going to be just fine. I want you to meet my father.* Then there was a flash of light and I woke up. When I told my sister a few days later, she said: *Dad wanted to introduce you to our grandfather (who was deceased before I was born).* Somehow I knew that was not the case. It is my belief that the Holy Spirit entered my heart that night and God began to work through me. He sent my father with the message because he knew I would trust him and not be afraid.

Many of you have heard my story about the painting of Asbury, but I will tell it again. I was sitting in my office at First Presbyterian Church on a Good Friday a little while after the above dream. I was the only one in the building. I was contemplating where I should attend worship on Easter Sunday. I heard footsteps coming down the hall. Suddenly, a man appeared in my doorway. He carried in front of him a large painting of Asbury. Light seemed to be shining out from the main doors and the windows in the painting. It took me by surprise, and I said to him, "Why do you have that painting here?" "That is my church." It was then that I heard God say, *Go home*! I knew that God knew Asbury was home for me and had been since I was a young child. He did however have a "but"; He said, *do not interfere with what Leon is doing*. I did not know what that meant at the time. So, I went and sat and listened and learned. I learned a lot from Rev. Leon VanWie's sermons. and I will always consider him the master at putting together a worship service. I always feel that God is speaking to me through Leon's sermons. It was God's way of telling me to listen.

A few weeks ago I was sitting at work struggling with some personal decisions I needed to make. My office adjoins a room where VBS had held Bible classes. There is a blackboard that covers the far wall of the room. As I opened the door between the two rooms, I saw written in large letters on the blackboard, "Trust God." I knew that message was for me. - a message from Jesus and the Holy Spirit.

I have often seen God in someone's eyes or heard his words coming from someone's lips. It happens to me a lot, so I have become very attuned to it. Sometime after COVID broke out, I began to feel restless, like I was being pulled by something. I felt like I was being pushed to leave Watertown and move to Sackets Harbor. I didn't fully pay attention to it until the gentle push became a shove. Things happened that made me sit up and take notice. I began to explore the idea. One Saturday, my sister in law (who lives in Sackets) and my niece from Rome, NY said lets go to Sackets for lunch and drive and walk around the village. We were walking down the main street, when my sister in law and niece saw a shop they wanted to go in. I said, "you go ahead; I will just go down the street and sit on a bench while you are in there." I walked down and sat on the bench. A few minutes later, an elderly gentleman came along and sat on the bench next to me. He began to talk to me. He said, "Isn't this a wonderful place?" I said, "Yes, it is." He said, "We need to make sure it remains a special place." He continued talking about places he had lived. A while later my sister in law and niece came along and said let's go get ice cream. They didn't seem to pay too much attention to the man on the bench, but he kept shouting after us to get the maple ice cream. The funny and crazy thing was that this man reminded me of Clarence in the movie, "It's a Wonderful Life," and by the way, the ice cream stand did not have any maple ice cream. My decision was made that day, and I am now living in Sackets Harbor, New York. Was it an angel that was speaking to me? I don't know, and I don't know why God has led me to Sackets Harbor. I don't need to know. I will continue to listen and follow God's direction.

My heart not only hears and sees God's messages, but I also feel his sadness and disappointment and the joy and appreciation when I understand. I felt his anger only once and it wasn't directed at me, but was directed through me. I was the vehicle he used to communicate. I remember my fingers flying across the keyboard, writing words, going to websites and not knowing how I got there. What I wrote was a message to someone else.

God speaks to me in many ways and in many forms. He is speaking to me now as I write these words. It is up to me as a disciple of Jesus Christ to listen, try to understand, follow where he leads and share as he directs me.

How is God speaking to you? Are You Listening? Who are the people God has sent to show you the way?

FROM THE TRUSTEES

It has been a busy summer. I would like to give you a summary of some of our projects. The roof on the parsonage garage has been replaced. This involved stripping off the old roofing, doing a few repairs and replacing with new shingles with a good ice and water barrier underneath.

The garden area along Franklin St. had become overgrown. Volunteers have worked on the ground area pulling weeds and maintaining flowers. Thanks to Jim Rafferty for trimming out tree branches and trimming bushes. The garden looks much better and our sign can be seen again on Franklin St.

The parking lot on Parker St. was improved by having Desormo Construction come in and level the stone. They also cut down the front of the lot so water can drain properly.

William, our custodian, has worked on an exit door from the chapel area so it can be opened for ventilation and for safe exit in case of fire. He also corrected the closing of the Parker St. door. There was a problem with this door not closing completely.

The painting and repair of the stairway leading up to the balcony near the main entrance will be completed this fall by Marty Patchen of All Side Painting. This is the group that painted and repaired the sanctuary and rotunda area.
