





Pastoral Letter: "On Earth as In Heaven"

Every week, perhaps every day, Christians around the world pray what we know as The Lord's Prayer or Jesus' Prayer. We know it by heart, because we feel it in our mind and our heart. I would say that it is something we not only hold dear, but it is something we believe to be true. One particular sentence of the prayer is speaking very clearly to me at present: "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

It means that we are asking for God's strength and purpose to bring the kingdom of God to earth until it matches its perfect image of heaven. A daunting task to be sure.

For many months, I have been hoping and praying for an opportunity for Asbury to demonstrate that purpose further than we currently do. Specifically, I've been praying for a "roll up the sleeves, hands on mission" that we could do here at home.

As you know from the news and personal observation, we have a growing homeless population in Watertown. We don't know their names. We don't know their situation. We don't know their history. We don't know a great deal. In many ways, they are for us strangers. But more importantly, THEY ARE OUR NEIGHBORS and, in many ways, they are what Jesus named, THE LEAST OF THESE MY BRETHREN.

An opportunity has come to us. The Missions Committee, with the support of the Board of Trustees, has agreed to provide supper on Wednesdays, during the coldest months. We have responded to a request from Urban Mission for churches to help in this regard, while Salvation Army offers temporary housing for some of the homeless.

These dinners will begin in a few weeks. I wish they were in place already, but there are details with Jefferson County that still need to be ironed out.

We need a team who will help with this dinner ministry. I believe we will let our guests into our Wesley Hall at 5:30 pm, and serve dinner until 7:30 pm. Not that it takes 2 hours to eat. It provides a warm place for them to stay at until they head to Salvation Army for overnight accommodations. I think we can play some family friendly movies with our television. Perhaps we should offer some board games. I don't know yet. What I do know, is that we can offer warm food for their stomachs, and compassion for their situation.

The weekly menu will be simple: Pulled pork on a bun, coleslaw, vegetable and dessert. It will be the same menu every week. Different churches will also pick a repeating menu for their night of service.

I would like to hold a planning meeting this Wednesday, November 30<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm in the Parlor. All who feel God's Spirit tugging at your heart should attend if able. If you can't get there in person, you may call or text me at the number below, or email me in order to get on board.

I truly believe this is an opportunity for Asbury to make a difference in the lives of our homeless neighbors. I hope you'll join me in this mission.
