#### WORDS OF WELCOME

#### \*CALL TO WORSHIP AND PRAYER FOR PEACE

Leader: We gather today before the cross in sorrow and in shame. We look for forgiveness, strength and mercy, though we deserve none.

People: We gather to remember how it was the day that our Savior died, to remember, to mourn, and to try and understand what happened that day, the day that Jesus showed the depth of His love for us by suffering and dying in our place.

Leader: Let us pray: Father, our hearts are heavy as we gather in the name of our crucified Lord... We watch with horror as we see Him hanging on the cross... We see the evil in the world around Him... We, too, Father, have denied our Lord... we have betrayed our Lord.

People: He died for our sins. Forgive us Lord, and love us still. Amen.

(verses 1, 3 & 4)

Leader: Let us begin our journey.

STATION 1: Pilate Condemns Jesus to Die (Matthew 27: 11-14, 25, 26b) Speaker:

Leader: We have been alone. We have been falsely accused, and no one has spoken for us. We have been treated unfairly by those who could have used their power for better purposes. We can understand some of your feelings as you stand silently before Pilate and watch him proclaim his own innocence as he condemns you, an innocent man.

People: O Lord, forgive me for not always being who I should be.

Leader: We find it easy to condemn the moral cowardice of Pilate. Have we ever given in to pressure from others to take the easy path rather than the right path? Have we ever chosen the easy path over the right path?

People: Forgive us God.

STATION 2: Jesus Accepts His Cross (Matthew 27: 27-31 & John 19:17) Speaker:

Leader: O Lord, forgive us for forgetting that in our weakness we are driven to trust in you, and that in such trust our weakness becomes your strength. Forgive our attitudes of self-pity that make me more repulsive than loving. I do not ask for crosses to bear. But when they come, give me the strength to bear them as those who follow your example.

People: O Lord, forgive us.

STATION 3: Simon Helps Carry the Cross (Luke 23: 26)

Speaker:

Leader: O Lord, forgive us for becoming so preoccupied with ourselves that we have become deaf and blind to those around us. Carrying your cross compels us to reach out to a hurting world, struggling individuals, with your love, your grace. Jesus, may we always be willing to carry your cross to the world.

People: O Lord, hear us. Make us people willing to carry the cross.

STATION 4: Jesus Speaks to the Women (Luke 23: 27-31)

Speaker:

Leader: O Lord, forgive our unwillingness to repent, to confess all that we are before you. Help us go beyond the repentance mouthed in words of false piety, to sweep away all the facades of who we try so hard to be before others. Help us once again to stand before God with a bare and open heart, to be real before you in every way.

People: O Lord, be merciful to us.

<u>STATION 5</u>: Jesus Is Stripped of His Garments (John 19: 23-25a) Speaker:

Leader: O Lord, forgive us for wanting to take the path of comfort and reward. Forgive us for our selfishness that wants to serve you in easy ways and seeks the reward of others' praise. Lord, teach us the humility of spirit that replaces self-centeredness with a sacrificial spirit. Make us vulnerable so that we may follow your example.

People: O Lord, change our hearts.

STATION 6: Jesus Is Nailed to the Cross (Mark 15: 23-32)

Speaker:

Leader: O Lord, we cannot comprehend the depth and breadth of your love. There are not enough words in all the languages together to describe what your love means to us. May our love for you and all your children in some way reflect your love. Let this dark night become fertile soil for growth in your love and for our growth as a community of faith. May you use this night to teach us how to love you and to love others the way you have loved us. Remind us of the deathly cost of sin. Forgive us for those things we have done that are displeasing to you. Forgive us for not allowing you to deal with the darkness that we harbor in the hidden recesses of our hearts. O Lord, make us better than we are... transform us into what we can be by your grace.

People: O Lord, forgive us for those things we have done and those things we have left undone. We long for newness, for hope, for renewal, for life, where there is now death. Out of this darkness bring to us the light of a new dawn. In your grace, be merciful to us.

STATION 7: Jesus Cares for His Mother (John 19: 25b-27)

Speaker:

Leader: O Lord, make us whole so that we may love with the compassion with which you love. Redeem us and make us new. Through your strength and by your grace, make us a conduit of your love, not just to the lovable, but to any who need to be cared for and loved.

People: O Lord, may it be so in our lives.

STATION 8: Jesus Dies on the Cross (Mark 15: 35-39)

Speaker:

Leader: O Lord, I cannot comprehend the depth and breadth of your love. There are not enough words in all the languages together to describe what your love means to me. May my love for you and my love for all your children in some way reflect your love. Let this dark night become fertile soil for growth in your love and for our growth as a community of faith. May you use this night to teach us how to love you and to love others the way you have loved us. O Lord, we long for newness, for hope, for renewal, for life, where there is now death. Out

of this darkness bring to us the light of a new dawn. O Lord, have mercy on us.


People: May we never forget...and may God hold us close in the palm of His hand.




