


Finding Jesus in the Psalms

Our Lenten Bible Study led by Pastor Michael Monday, February 19th through March 25th from 7:15-8:30 p.m.

Journey with us for a meaningful encounter with the Psalms through the season of Lent. Combining an interpretation of the Psalms with real life stories, the study moves through the familiar words of Psalm 23 back to the painful cries of Psalm 22 uttered by Jesus on the cross. The study includes reflections on the life of King David and the original context of the writings, along with connections between the Psalms and the life and death of Jesus the Messiah.

Dear Asbury Family,

"To grant to those who mourn in Zion - to give them a beautiful headdress instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the garment of praise instead of a faint spirit; that they may be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that he may be glorified." - Isaiah 61: 3

Wednesday, February 14, also Valentine's Day, is Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of the Lenten season. On Ash Wednesday, we recall the biblical custom of covering ourselves in ashes. We will have a service with Imposition of Ashes in the chapel on Ash Wednesday at 12:15 & 6:30 p.m.

While our Advent celebrations are filled with joy as we remember the birth of our King, Lent is when we focus on the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Traditionally, many believers choose to participate in some sort of fasting during this time - people have been known to fast from various foodstuffs as well as television and internet usage. Others decided to study the Bible more closely or experience a time of solitude. Perhaps you will commit to attending services from now until the glory of Easter (my favorite holiday!!) or dedicate a larger portion of your day to a time of prayer.

Whatever your personal preference, Lent can be the time when you decide to let go of old habits and develop a more joyful, Christ-filled way of living. I would like to invite you and your family to join me as we prepare for a time of tremendous spiritual growth and renewal.

Lent.



With each gust of wind I heard a loud creaking noise. It sounded like the building was going to come apart. I was sitting at the top of my staircase in my apartment. Hanging on the wall above me to my right was a statue of Jesus. The statue had been passed from my mother to my sister and from my sister to me. Directly in front of me were the two pictures of Asbury's bell tower one of the tower as it was 40 or 50 years ago and the other as it is today after being refurbished. The doors at each end of the long hallway were closed. There I sat in fear with a blanket wrapped around me and a flashlight and my cell phone sitting on a table in front of me. I lived through the Blizzard of '77, the first big ice storm and the microburst, but this was different - I wasn't alone during those storms. After a couple of hours the winds began to subside a little. I climbed into bed thinking maybe the power would come back on before morning. I woke up around 2 a.m.; the only light was from my flashlight. I looked out the window - all I saw was blackness; I could not see anything else.


As the sun came up the next morning I looked out the window and saw several large trees had come down. Miraculously, none of them had fallen on buildings or cars. I opened the blinds to the patio doors at the back of my apartment. There in front of the glass were several birds fluttering around. There were bluebirds, finches and a single cardinal. They fluttered there for a few minutes as if saying, *you are going to be ok*. They then flew away. I called my brother who lives down the road from me. He had a generator. I packed a bag and some food and went and weathered the wind and snow storms of the next few days with my family.

One week later as I walked into my workplace, I was informed that my position at my place of employment was being eliminated. As God led me through the building to the outside door, I did not feel anger or sadness. I felt only relief, as I walked through the door to the outside, I know as I face the future, there will be more storms to weather; but I also know that God will always be there right beside me. I am being compensated through March 31 - EASTER SUNDAY! New beginnings?





