They then go and purchase those items in bulk and take them to the Urban Mission Food Pantry. 16,431 items were delivered to the Pantry in 2023.

FROM THE TRUSTEES

It has been another busy year for the Asbury Trustees. The largest single project was the purchase and installation of a new organ for the Chapman Chapel. This was a \$20,000 investment completely covered by private donations. It was a testimony of support to further the music program at Asbury.

As we approach 2024, we are looking at repairing the locks on the Franklin St. entrance. The current mechanisms have been in place since the building was built (1965). They are worn out. This could cost as much as \$1500 - for each door.

The second door project is the likely replacement of the entrance on Parker St. This set of doors was probably installed over 100 years ago. One side does not function due to an iron sill rusted into the base of the door. The working side is badly weathered with deep cracks in the woodwork. The stained glass in the upper part of the opening will be saved. This will likely be a moderately expensive project. We are looking at design options, but no cost estimates have been prepared.

It was good to see our sanctuary filled during the Northern Choral Society Christmas Concert. It was stimulating to hear the power produced by the congregation, orchestra, organ and the 65 members of the NCS. The River Ringers Handbell Choir and 30-member Children's Choir added musical variety to the program. The Trustees did spend some time preparing for this and the results were a joy to see and hear. It is a pleasure to be able to share our beautiful sanctuary with the community.
