Following are some examples of how our Mission Committee and members of our church family have stepped up this past month to help our neighbors in need.

Bishop Héctor visits area affected by recent storms

Upper New York Area Resident Bishop Héctor A. Burgos Núñez made a trip to Rome, NY on Monday, delivering storm relief supplies, leading a community in prayer, meeting with survivors, seeing the damage first hand, and spreading messages of hope.

Many people living in affected areas, including Lowville, Rome, Canastota, Eden, and other areas are still cleaning up after all the damage caused by these storms, leaving many in urgent need of assistance. Please continue to pray for all of those impacted.

Asbury Helping Out a Sister Church



The flooding in Lowville in July was astronomical! So much damage was incurred for so many places. It will take a long time to recover.

The Lowville United Methodist Church and parsonage were not spared. They both had 3-4 feet of water in their basements, leading to damage which will take a long time to recover from.

A group of Asburians volunteered to help out on two different days with some maintenance in the parsonage.

<u>Day One</u>: Max Bovee, Joanne Rhode, Deb and Herb Van Houten, Sue and Glen Snell, and Carol and Bill Plemons painted.

<u>Day Two</u>: Lorraine Irwin, Jean Gianfagna, Darlene Chartrand, Bob Muntz, and Bill and Carol Plemons worked at removing wallpaper.

Between all, 42 hours of work was done. It was nice to be able to help out, and our work was appreciated. Thanks to all who helped!

Also, the Asbury MISSION Committee voted to send \$500 to Lowville UMC to help with repairs and replacement of a water heater.

At their July meeting the ASBURY MISSION COMMITTEE voted to support two international missionaries: **Wesley & Janna Cressman Family**, Missionaries in Spain, and **Patrick Abro**, Missionary in Burundi.

Listed below are some ministry highlights shared by the **Cressmans**:

- Ministry to children and women during the school year on Fridays is a ministry for which Janna has a passion and is close to her heart. They will also be meeting some during the summer. We anticipate Janna having the mothers into our home for a time of sharing on a more personal basis. Most of them do not know Jesus. We recently had an English class with the children and anticipate having another one this summer.
- A park ministry is in the works with a family in the church using evangelism and English.

- The beginning of relationships with Muslims is in progress. These people live and/or work near our apartment. We want to start with friendships and let them see the love of Jesus in us. The goal is for them to find Jesus to be their Savior and develop a personal relationship with Him. We would love to invite some of them to our home.
- This summer we will be hosting a series of children's services at the local church on Sundays. We will be studying about the Apostle Paul and memorizing scripture. We will also be having some fun times with the children.
- Wesley will continue being a part of two small groups throughout the week.

We want to be available for whatever doors the Lord opens for us!

Our greatest financial need right now is our general support. With inflation and the fact that the Euro is now worth more than the dollar, we need increased support. Your consideration of our ministry is a blessing.

Patrick Abro is a missionary with the General Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church serving as Health Operation Manager in the Burundi Annual Conference. He was commissioned in May 2016.

Patrick is from Côte d'Ivoire, where he is a member of the Jehova Jire United Methodist Church in Abidjan in the Côte d'Ivoire Annual Conference. He holds a basic degree in literature from Félix Houphouët-Boigny University in Abidjan, a degree in communications and human resources from the College of Abidjan, and master's degree in social science from the National High Institute of Social Science. He has additional training in project management and monitoring and evaluation. He has worked as a coordinator in the evaluation and monitoring of community projects in the annual conference's program to control HIV/AIDS and other pandemic diseases.



Patrick Abro, Missionary in Burundi

Born into a Christian home, Patrick was extremely active in the United Methodist Youth Fellowship on local, district, and annual conference levels. He was conference youth president and has also served the general church. He was a delegate to the 2012 General Conference in Tampa, Florida, and for the 2013-2016 quadrennium represented the West Africa Central Conference on the Division of Ministries for Young People (DMYP) of Discipleship Ministries (General Board of Discipleship). He also represented DMYP on the United Methodist Global AIDS Fund during the same quadrennium. He is a member of the United Methodist Health Board of Côte d'Ivoire.

His call to mission emerges from his faith journey. "God called me at a young age," Patrick says. "God called me in many ways during my journey, and I learned I can serve God in many ways. God opened my heart, my mind, my spirit, and my strength; God touched me and led me into his mission."

Changes at the Urban Mission

The Watertown Urban Mission is no longer the old Urban Mission that most of us knew. The Impossible Dream Thrift Store has permanently closed. In the old thrift store space is now what is called "New Beginnings" and a "Code Blue" room.

New Beginnings is for people who are starting over from a house fire or for homeless people finding an apartment. In both cases, the people start over with New Beginnings by receiving vouchers for clothing, furniture, kitchen equipment, etc., which is all located in the bottom floor of the old thrift store. Vouchers are exchanged and the people may choose the items they need. These items are given away, not sold.

New Beginnings also includes an area for the community to help those in need. For example, if a person needs to sign-up for food stamps, Medicare, health insurance, etc., there are people there to help them or to help them find the help they need. New Beginnings will be open from 10:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.

The top floor, which held the Impossible Dream Thrift Store, is now a "Code Blue" room, the only one in Jefferson County. If the temperature is 32 degrees or below, individuals may sleep here on cots. In the Summer, if people need a place to cool down, they can come to the Mission. In addition to a place to sleep at night, individuals may use this area in the daytime, unlike the Salvation Army. The Salvation Army needs their space for serving their every-day noon meal! This space can sleep ten and has shelves for their belongings. Food that is not perishable is available.

The Food Pantry hours have changed to 9:30 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. Another change is the Friday afternoon food giveaway from 1:30 P.M. to 3:00 P.M. This food comes from the leftover perishables (fruit and produce) at grocery stores. One must sign up on Friday morning to be eligible to receive this food. Meals-on-Wheels is still under the banner of the Urban Mission.

So, one can tell there have been many changes at the Urban Mission. Much of this is due to the lack of income resulting from fewer people shopping at the Impossible Dream.


