## **Warm Greetings, Friends!**



We trust you are doing well and enjoying the blessings of the Lord in your life!

As we draw closer to the day that we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, I wanted to take this opportunity to remind you that without the Resurrection, we have nothing!

Paul, in his first letter to the Church at Corinth, wrote the following:

1 Corinthians 15:17-19 (NKJV) - And if Christ is not risen, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins! Then also those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men the most pitiable.

There were those in the early church who were not only backing away from the claim of the Resurrection but also doing their best to get others to follow their lead. This denial of the Resurrection was a "non-negotiable" for the Apostle Paul.

It was amazing and even a bit unbelievable for so many to believe that a mere man could rise from the dead, yet we know that Jesus Christ was more than a mere man. He was the Son of God who had lived a sinless, blameless life and had died on the cross, much like any criminal from that day would die.

Paul was saying that if you remove the Resurrection from the Gospel story, then our faith is futile, and we are still in our sins. But thank God, we are not still in our sins because we recognize and receive the message of the cross and the empty tomb!

The Resurrection changes <u>everything</u>! We now have freedom from sin and all the condemnation that comes with it. As believers, we can take comfort in the fact that our Salvation is assured and heaven is our future! We can have hope for tomorrow, and we can be witnesses to others around us that they, too, can have this freedom as well! I need this, and I'm sure you do too!

Paul didn't start the following verses with an apology, but he declared with a bold statement, as we can see here:

1 Corinthians 15:20–22 (NKJV) - But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of them that slept. For since by man came death, by Man also came the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive.

Jesus changes everything... let Him!

We hope to see you for **Easter Services** on **Sunday**, **April 20** at either the Sunrise Service at Thompson Park, at 6:11 a.m., led by Rev. Toby Schilling; our 8:15 a.m. Chapel Service, or the Main Service at 10:15 a.m. led by me.

# Helping Children Understand Differing Abilities

Formerly called children with special needs, children with differing abilities are an integral part of our childcare and universal pre-kindergarten programs at New Day Children's Center. Having an inclusionary program benefits all children as typically developing children can learn and understand how to communicate and help their differently abled friends. Young children often have questions about children who may act and/or appear different from themselves. When your child asks a question about someone who is differently abled, consider it an opportunity to talk about a new and interesting topic rather than turning this into a topic to be avoided.

It is important to be honest and direct. If a young child says, "Why can't she walk?", you could say, "Some people walk like you and I do, and others move a different way." As children get older, a more complex response is in order. If you don't know much about the person your child is asking about, find a way to respectfully speak with that child's family to learn more or facilitate a conversation between the children themselves.

Avoid making assumptions and interpretations. Whether you know the person your child is asking about or not, avoid adding your interpretation of how a person may feel about their disability or what caused it.

There are many assumptions and misconceptions about differing abilities such as, "people with differing abilities are special and should be treated differently" or "differently abled people live hard and challenging lives." You can help your children talk about differing abilities in an accurate and respectful way by avoiding assumptions and taking the time to get to know someone on an individual level.

Children are like sponges. If you use positive language with your child they will continue to use that kind of language on their own. For example, explain that hearing aids help others hear and wheelchairs help others move around, instead of using a negative connotation such as, he can't hear, she can't walk.

It is also important to lead by example. Children look to adults for guidance on how to act, especially if they are in a new or unfamiliar setting. If you stare, point, quietly move to the other side of the street to whisper about someone, or talk down to in the presence of a differently abled individual, your child will see, hear, and internalize these behaviors. Take time to become aware of your own attitudes, beliefs, and assumptions around differing abilities before talking to your children. If you approach someone with kindness, openness, respect, and curiosity, your children will do the same.

We are all different in some way and we all do things every day to adjust to our unique circumstances. For example, someone who wears glasses uses them to correct blurry vision, just as someone who is non-verbal may use an assistive device like an iPad to communicate. None of these things are "wrong", they are just different ways of being in the world. Children use the word "wrong" because they have been socialized by adults and society's attitudes about what is considered "normal" versus "abnormal".

All children are children and all want the same things - to have friends, to play, to be loved, to laugh, to feel included, and to participate in activities together with their friends and family. The more we can relate to each other the more understanding, compassion, and interest we can develop.

# **Easter Preparations!**




