
We Remember...

FROM THE TRUSTEES

The Trustees have been busy planning various projects that we hope will be finished soon.

The largest project is work on Parker Street. Capital Construction will be starting the first or second week of June to re-point some of the stone blocks which have deteriorated due to the freeze/thaw cycles. They will also establish vents to interact with the previous interior system which will help prevent the huge ice formations in the winter. A handrail will be installed at the red door. Capital Construction is going to scrape, prime, and paint the area of exposed wood between the top of the stone and the roofline (the cornice). Our Capital Improvement Funds will cover this cost.

The building security has been updated and improved with additional cameras within the church. Bill Smith has donated a mountain of time and expertise for this project. Our thanks to the Memorial Fund for providing this updated equipment.

Our Capital Improvement Fund is also covering the cost of the removal and installation of a new carpet in the Parlor. This is scheduled for early June. We also expect some updating of furniture. Many thanks go to our maintenance chief, William Noviski, for repairing the Parlor walls - spackling, priming & painting prior to the new carpet installation.

Asbury is fortunate to have the loyal support of the congregation which allows us to be able to pay for these projects. Thank you! See you in church!

Out of the Darkness Comes Light!

Mother's Day can be a hard day for me. I am reminded how much I miss my 3 children and 3 grandchildren. as they are scattered across the country. I love my 2 sons and daughter equally and love that they have all brought something unique and special to my life. However, anyone who has 3 children probably knows that the middle child can be the one that often gets left behind as each child jockeys for attention and their place in the family dynamics. My oldest child, Joshua, was the first grandchild born to my mother-in-law and father-in-law. He received a lot of attention from grandparents, aunts, and uncles, so when our second child, Dustin, came along, Joshua had to share that attention. Then along came our only daughter, Samantha. She was our youngest and only girl, which placed her at the center of attention. It became evident to me that Dustin would never have as much one on one time as the other two. Because my 2 boys were so different in personality and nature and Samantha was a girl, it was a challenge to balance my time and attention between the 3. Joshua and Samantha were much more verbal about their wants and needs. Dustin was much more laid back and even-tempered. I remember the times we would be going somewhere as a family and for whatever reason we would be taking 2 cars. Joshua and Samantha would immediately speak up, saying, "I am riding with Dad." Dustin would hang back and say very softly, "I will ride with you, Mom." All 3 of my children gave me fits as they went through the teen and young adult years. However, they all blossomed into adults that I have a great respect for. Three adults that I can go to and bounce ideas off of and ask for advice.

This year on Friday night before Mother's Day 2025, I received a call from Dustin. He sounded tired and a little down. He said it had been a busy couple of weeks for him, with a lot of travel, some hectic days at work, and some nights of little sleep. He said he probably would not come up until Memorial Day weekend. I was disappointed when he said he wasn't coming up, but I tried not to let it show. I said, ok, but I am sure the disappointment shown through. Since Dustin lives closer to me than my other 2 children, I think he feels it is his duty to take care of Mom. The next day Dustin called and asked what I was doing that day. I said nothing important. He said that he was in Clay, New York, which is only about an hour away. He said he wanted to come up and take me to dinner. He seemed much more relaxed and in a better mood. I knew that God had seen my disappointment and had blessed me with a special Mother's Day gift. We went to dinner and had some much cherished one-on-one time together.

I have been blessed with 3 very unique and wonderful gifts that have brought joy and light to my life, and I thank God for them every day.

I awoke on Mother's Day to sunshine and blue sky. It had been a rainy and dreary couple of weeks, and I felt compelled to get out and enjoy the sunshine. So, I went to Asbury's 8:15 a.m. Worship Service. Asbury has some very gifted Lay Servants and Pastors, and I often go to both services. I find it compelling to get different perspectives on the scriptures. On that day I was not disappointed. Both sermons were thought-provoking and helped me connect the dots. If you have not been to an 8:15 a.m. service, give it a try some time. You may be surprised at how fulfilling it is. God is both a shepherd and a teacher. He is forever trying to gather us and teach us to follow him. I don't believe I will ever be able to learn all that God has to teach, but I am going to enjoy trying. Out of disappointment, discouragement, and darkness come light and joy. I have gone through many dark periods, but always the light shines at the end - a little brighter each time. It is up to me to share the light and joy with others.


